Ambassadorial Series: Building Better Climate Change Policy & Stronger Carbon Markets – Lessons from the UK



About the Conference

Asia has been powering ahead with Green Growth. The region's renewable energy market will be worth US\$50-55 billion over the next 5 to 10 years, and emission trading in the region is expected to gain traction as policymakers focus on developing a definitive agreement to fight climate change. The Clean Development Mechanism (created under the Kyoto Protocol) also continues to grow in spite of uncertainty surrounding its future after 2012. As of July, there were 2,300 clean development projects globally, a 35 percent on-year increase with Asia bagging three quarters of the projects. Developing Southeast Asia however, still trails its larger neighbours, China and India.

In light of these developments, this conference will feature talks and panels by industry experts, government officials and academics on how the UK is acting to avert the challenges of climate change. Discussions will address carbon reducing mechanisms that can be used in Southeast Asia such as the role of energy efficiency in the power industry and other businesses; developing carbon markets through renewable energy projects; carbon finance; building sustainable supply chains and cover Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) perspectives. Challenges such as carbon fraud will also be explored. Both local and regional perspectives will be examined by ASEAN-based speakers. The event will conclude with a short address by Lord Oxburgh of Liverpool on climate science and business.

Lord Oxburgh served as chairman of The Shell Transport and Trading Company until its unification with Royal Dutch Petroleum earlier this year. He is a member of the House of Lords, United Kingdom, and is currently President of the Carbon Capture and Storage Association and Chairman of wind energy company Falck Renewables. In March this year, he was appointed to chair an independent Scientific Assessment Panel in the UK, to examine important elements of the published science of the Climatic Research Unit at the University of East Anglia which had come under public scrutiny. In Singapore, Lord Oxburgh is co-chairman of International Advisory Panel on Clean Energy and has been a member of the Science and Engineering Research Council at A*STAR; the National Environment Research Council; and the Advisory Council for Science and Technology.
