The Alex Josey Private Archives consists of documents on Malaysian political parties, correspondences of the politicians, the Hock Lee Riots as well as Private Archives on communist insurgency in Malaysia. The Private Archives also include Josey's articles on Lee Kuan Yew, Malays, Lim Chin Siong and other political detainees.

Alex Josey, writer, political commentator and journalist was born in 1910. He began writing when he was 12 in England. He worked as a foreign correspondent in the region and was the press secretary of Prime Minister Lee Kuan Yew for 10 years. He was the Publications Manager of the Singapore International Chamber of Commerce (SICC) when he was crippled by the Parkinson's disease in 1984.

Mr Josey had written more than 30 books. Among his books are Lee Kuan Yew, Asia-Pacific Socialism and The Trial of Sunny Ang.
