
#### 1.1 Review of Newspaper Subscriptions


# **2** Collection Management

The Library accessioned 839 titles (324 monographs and 515 journal articles) during this period. The Library also archived approximately 75 hours of audio and video recordings of in-house seminars, conferences, workshops and symposiums transferred from Admin. The Library met the KPI of releasing 95% of new titles within 14 days upon check-in.



#### 3.2 Library Visitorship

1,598 users came through the Library in this quarter, 13% increase than last quarter and 19% increase year-on-year. Among the 477 external visitors (representing 30% of the total visitorship), one of them was Joyce Tan Wai Wai, a librarian from Research for Social Advancement (REFSA) Malaysia. REFSA Library just established two years ago and its collection mainly focuses on political, social and cultural aspects of Malaysia. Ms Tan visited ISEAS Library during her 2-day seminar trip to Singapore, seeking and exchanging views with our staff on a few library management issues, such as library access policy, user registration procedure, archiving and categorise personal documents.

Another external user, Mr Ignatius Albert Wijaya, who just graduated from NUS Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, sent a farewell card to express his thanks to ISEAS Library for supporting his study during the visit.



Among the external visitors, 15% of them also viewed Yusof Ishak Gallery and NSC Archaeology Unit Gallery respectively. One of them wrote on the visitor book: "I belong to the fortunate generation who knew Encik Yusof Ishak, a beloved statesman and together with Puan Noor Aisha. They made Singaporean proud. Thank you for this exhibition, ISEAS."

The increase is partially attributed to the external users from Asian Graduate Student Fellowships Programme, Asian Research Institute (NUS) and the in-house scanning of four volumes of Myanmar Government Annual Report (totalling 1,579 pages) loaned from Mr Thein Sein, Former President of Myanmar (2011 to 2016).

## 3.5 Work Experience Programme with NUS Students

This quarter, the Library offered the internship opportunity to Southeast Asian Studies students from NUS Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences. Three student interns worked on Wang Gungwu Collection during the school holiday from Jul to 4 Aug 2017. One of them, a fresh graduate from NUS, also extended the internship till 15 Sep 2017 before her career started. On the first day of internship, the Head of Library, Mr Pitt conducted a briefing on the processing of the private papers, to the three student interns, library staff and Mr Gao Jiankang who was assigned to assist in analysing Wang Gungwu Private Paper.
